

List of Parishes Soon to be Searchable

Searchable parishes will comprise 1548 pages of transcripts, a little more than a fifth of the nearly 7000 pages. There are 24 datasets covering 21 different parishes.

60% of the parishes on the list are not now in use, with some being in ruin. About a third contain material not found elsewhere. This may be years not covered elsewhere, or it may be different events such as conversion or vestrymen. In the case of Dringah the transcripts are almost the only source of church records. Many of the Monumental Inscriptions are also unique.

A number of parishes are shown with alternate names. Some are spelling variations, or historical names, but in other cases, the parish name is not the same place name as where the church was. This is the case with Tullagh. The church for Tullagh parish has always been in Baltimore.

The collection is not just of interest to people with Irish ancestry. A number of the parishes recorded were near British Army garrisons. This is the case with Bandon, Kinsale, Fermoy and Ballingarry Co Limerick in this release, but Youghal, Brigown, Kilmahon, Cork St Nicholas, Cork St Lukes and Shandon St Anns also have many British military entries because of proximity to a garrison.
