Dr P Smythe-Wood's Irish Newspaper Index

Selected families, mainly from Co Tyrone

'Series A'

The late Dr Patrick Smythe-Wood presented a large collection of card indexes to the IGRS Library, reflecting his various interests, - the Irish in Canada, Ulster families, various professions etc. These include abstracts from various Irish Newspapers, including the Belfast Newsletter, which are printed below. Abstracts are included for all papers up to 1864, but excluding any entries in the Belfast Newsletter prior to 1801, as they are fully available online. Dr Smythe-Wood often found entries in several newspapers for the one event, & these will be shown as one entry below. Entries dealing with RIC Officers, Customs & Excise Officers, Coastguards, Prison Officers, & Irish families in Canada will be dealt with in separate files, although a small cache of Canadian entries is included here, being families closely associated with Co Tyrone. In most cases, Dr Smythe-Wood has recorded the exact entry, but in some, marked thus *, the entries were adjusted into a database, so should be treated with more caution. There are further large card indexes of Miscellaneous notes on families which are not at present being digitised, but which often deal with the same families treated below.

ADAMS: [NWH, Sat 19 Jul 1856*] Bridget, eldest daughter of William Adams of Brachagh House, Portadown, was married to John Murtagh on 13 July at Mulaville, by the Rev Mr Irwin, PP. *Belfast & Provincial Directory 1858-9 describes John Murtagh as Spirit Dealer of Stewartstown.*

ADAMS: [BNL, Oct 1841*] Mary, 4th daughter of Mathew Adams of Portglenone, Esq, was married, as his 2nd wife, to William, eldest son of John Park, at Portglenone, by Rev Robert Allen. [BMO, 15 Aug 1868] August 10th at Armagh, Mary, relict of the late William Nash Esq, of Stewartstown, & mother of the Rev William Park, AM, of Ballymena.

ALLEN: see PARKE

ALLEN: [BNL, Thu 10 Jul 1832*] Mary, daughter of the late Robert Allen of Cookstown, was married on 6 Jul to William, eldest son of John Park, at 1st Ballymoney Presbyterian Church.

ALLEN: [BNL, Tue 9 Feb 1858*] To Elizabeth, widow of James Graham Allen, a son.

ALLEN: [BCC, 22 Nov 1825*, & BNL, Fri 18 Nov 1825*] Margaret, eldest daughter of James Allen, Surgeon, of Stewartstown, was married to William Campbell on 17 Nov. [ECE, 24 Feb 1831, & BNL, Tue 22 Feb 1831] At Stewartstown, James Allen Esq, Surgeon. [LST, 3 Feb 1853*, TYC, 28 Jan 1853*, BNL, 26 Jan 1853*, & ARG, 29 Jan 1853*] Mrs Sarah Allen, widow, of Stewartstown, died 17 Jan, aged 77 years, at the residence of her daughter, Mrs Campbell, Moneymore.

ALLEN: [BCC, 22 Dec 1823, & BNL, Fri 19 Dec 1823] On the 10th inst, the Rev Robert Allen, of Stewartstown, to Sarah Jane, third daughter of Samuel Little Esq, of same place. [LST, 7 Mar 1838, & BNL, 27 Feb 1838] On the 23rd inst... after an illness of 10 weeks.... Sarah Jane, wife of Rev Robert Allen of Stewartstown. [BNL, Mon 30 Nov 1863*, & LST, 28 Nov 1863*] Sarah Anne Allen, daughter of Rev Robert Allen of Ballina, Co Mayo & Stewartstown, Co Tyrone, died 24 Nov 1863 after a few days' illness. ALLEN: [BMO, 22 Jan 1859, & SLC, 22 Jan 1859] Jan 18th in St Marylebone Church, London, by the Rev C J P Eyre, R Austen Allen, MD, to Mary Francklin, daughter of Andrew Risk on 18 Jan 1859. [BNL, 30 Dec 1861] Nov 11 at Meerut, India, the infant daughter of Dr R Austen Allen, HM's 71st Regt. [ARG, 16 May 1863, & LST, 16 May 1863] March 30th at Fort Atteleesch, Puryaub, India, the wife of Dr R Austen Allen, 71st H.L.I. Regiment, of a son. [*R Austen Allen, 3rd son of Rev Robert Allen of Stewartstown.*]

ALLEN: [CCH, 20 Jun 1846*, & LST, 19 Jun 1846*] John Little Allen, son of Rev Robert Allen, on 3rd June 1846, aged 21. [BNL, 16 Jun 1846, NWH, Sat 15 Jun 1846, & ARG, 16 Jun 1846] *Similar notice, but date of death given as 8th June.*

ANDERSON: see MASON

ANDERSON: [BNL, 26 Aug 1834*] Maria Josepha, youngest[?] daughter of Anthony Anderson, was married to George Holmes, son of James Parke, on 19 Jul in Quebec, by the Rev Wm Anderson. [QUE, 19 Mar 1840*] Mrs Maria Josepha Parke died on 14 Feb 1840 at the residence of David Grainger.

ANDERSON: [NWH, 4 Apr 1825*] William Anderson, junr, late of Coalisland, who arrived in Baltimore in October 1824, died in Baltimore on 4 Feb 1825.

ANDINA[?]: [BNL, 18 May 1841*] Mary, youngest daughter of Hugh Andina of Ballymacgurnett[?], was married on 14 May to John Murch[?] of Stewartstown.

ANKETELL: [ECE, 4 Oct 1832*, & NCT, Fri 28 Sep 1832] Rev John Anketell of Clonoe, died 15 Sep at Stewartstown, in his 82nd year. [BNL, 7 Jun 1836*, & NCT, 7 Jun 1836*] Mrs Anne Anketell, widow of Rev John Anketell, died 26 May 1836, aged 82.

ASHE: [SMP, 21 Jan 1823*, BCC, 20 Jan 1823*, & ECE, 22 Jun 1823] Walter Ashe, of Cornwall, Co Donegal, was married to Lydia, daughter of John McReynolds, on 12 Jan at Donaghely parish church, by the Rev E M Stewart.

ATKINSON: see HALL

ATKINSON: [BNL, Tue 10 Nov 1807*] Mary, daughter of Wolsly Atkinson, of the parish of Drumcree, was married to Thomas Sloan on 4 Nov at Drumcree, by the Rev Robt Christy.

BAILIE: see HUNTER, & also SIMPSON

BAILIE: [BNL, 28 Feb 1826*] Major Bailie of Donagheury predeceased his daughter Elizabeth. [*Notes not clear, - possibly death notice for Elizabeth?*]

BAILIE: [NCT, 30 Jan 1829*, BNL, Tue 27 Jan 1829*, & NWH, 29 Jan 1829*] Thomas Bailie Esq, late of the Tyrone Regt, died on 20th Jan, aged 54, at the house of his nephew, Mr Thos Johnston, Gorten, near Coalisland.

BALEY: [BNL, 19 Nov 1813*] Sarah, widow of the late Walter Baley, was married on 12 Nov to Robert McReynolds, Lieut of Clonoe[?] Yeomanry, at Stewartstown, by the Rev John Anketell.

BALLINTINE: see HUNTER

BARNARD: see STUART

BARRY: [BNL, 28 Sep 1849*, & ARG, 24 Sep & 1 Oct 1849*] Mary Jane, 3rd daughter of Andrew Barry Esq, of Denrock, Co Antrim, was married to Thomas Waugh on 17 Sep in the 1st Presbyterian Church, Coleraine, by the Rev W Richey.

BARTON: see STEWART

BATHURST: [BNL, Fri 5 Mar 1830] Emmeline, only surviving child of Benjamin Bathurst, & granddaughter of the Bishop of Limerick, was married to the 3rd Earl of Castlestewart at the British Embassy. The bride was given away by Lord Stewart de Roshtay.

BATHURST: [BNL, 26 Apr 1852] April 15 at Wells, by the Ven Archdeacon Law, the Rev R A Bathurst, nephew of the Earl of Castlestewart, to Jane, eldest daughter of the late Rev R Harkness, Rector of East Brent, Somersetshire.

BEATTIE: [LST, 28 Dec 1842*] Samuel Beattie, of Ardtrea, was married to Lillia Ann, only daughter of James Whan, on 20 Dec by the Rev David Meahy, Presbyterian Minister of Albany.

BELL: [LST, 27 Aug 1845*] On 1 Aug at Warrenpoint, aged 82, Andrew Thomas Bell of Belmont, Co Tyrone, Esq, late Captain 27th Regt.

BELL: [BMO, 5 Apr 1862] March 24 at Aughrim, Stewartstown, the wife of Mr Gordon Bell, of a son.

BELL: [BNL, Fri 2 Sep 1803*] Helena, daughter of Humphrey Bell, was married “a few days ago” to James Gausson of Ballyrowan, Co Londonderry. [BNL, 4 Jun 1811*] Humphrey Bell, at Belmont, Co Tyrone, aged 73, after a lingering illness. [[BNL, Fri 11 Dec 1818*] Mrs Bell, widow of the late Humphrey Bell, of Belmont, Co Tyrone, died 20 Nov at Ballyronan, aged 88. [BCC, 6 Nov 1824, & ECE, 18 Nov 1824] On Sunday 31st ult at his residence, Warwick Lodge, Co Londonderry, in the 49th year of his age, Henry Humphrey Bell Esq, son of the late Humphrey Bell of Belmont, Co Tyrone, Esq.

BELL: [BSH, 11 Aug 1837*, NCT, 3 Aug 1837*, BNL, Fri 11 Aug 1837*, & LST, 5 Aug 1837] At St Michan’s Church, Humphrey Bell Esq, of Warwick Lodge, Co Derry, son of the late Humphrey Bell, was married to Henrietta, youngest daughter of Andrew Thos Bell Esq, of Belmont, Co Tyrone, late Capt, 27th Regt. [BNL, 24 Apr 1838*] On 12 Apr, the wife of Henry Humphrey Bell Esq, at Hollywood, Co Down, of a son. [BNL, 29 Jan 1855] January 15, Henry Humphrey Bell Esq, of Belmont, Co Tyrone, aged 39 years.

BELL: [LST, 5 Mar 1847*] Mary Jane, daughter of William Bell, was married to Moses Hogg on 3 Feb 1847 at Paisley, Scotland, by the Rev Dr Lymington.

BELL: [TYC, 17 Sep 1852] On the 8th instant, very suddenly, Mr Robert Bell, Drumcouris, for many years elder in the Presbyterian Congregation of Coagh.

BELL: [BSH, 6 Jul 1838, ECE, 12 Jul 1838, LST, 11 Jul 1838, & BNL 6 Jul 1838] July 2nd in St Thomas’s Church, by the Rev John Fea, Thomas Aubrey Bell Esq, of Belmont, Co Tyrone, (late Captain, 11th Regiment), to Elizabeth, eldest daughter of the late Henry Humphrey Bell Esq, of Warwick Lodge, Co Derry. [BNL, 10 Jul 1849*, & COH, Sat 14 Jul 1849*] Thomas Aubrey Bell Esq, of Belmont, Stewartstown, Capt 11th Regt of Foot, died 5 Jul 1849 at Warwick Lodge, Magherafelt.

BELL: [BNL, 8 Dec 1837] Of typhus fever on the 26th ult, Mr William John Bell of Windmill Place, near Coagh, Co Tyrone, aged 59 years. [LST, 4 Mar 1840] On the 1st inst, at his residence, Windmill Place, near Coagh, Co Tyrone, in the 18th year of his age, of inflammation of the stomach, Arthur Bell, eldest son of the late William John Bell of same place. [Short Eulogy]. [REF, 6 Mar 1840] similar notice, but “19th year”, & “elder son”.

BELLINGHAM: see HOLMES

BERGEN: [BNL, 16 Jul 1861] June 23 in New York, Mary, wife of Wm Bergen of Coalisland, County Tyrone, aged 67 years.

BISSELL: see GREENE

BLACK: [LST, 19 Jun 1844*, NCT, 13 Jun 1844*, BNL, Jun 1844*, & CCH, 15 Jun 1844*] Rev James Black, a Wesleyan Minister, was married to Mary, eldest daughter of Alexander Little on 2nd June in the Methodist Chapel, Frederick Street, Belfast, by the Rev Tackaberry.

BLACKER: [BSH, 3 Mar 1837] On Thursday week at Rosetta, near Belfast, of nervous fever, Eliza Ellen, relict of the late Rev James Stewart Blacker, Rector of Keady, Co Armagh.

BLADEN: [BNL, Fri 15 Aug 1828*, & NCT, 15 Aug 1828*] Isaac Nils Bladen, surgeon, of Stewartstown, son of Mr Bladen of Antigua, was married to Sarah Jane Garrett, daughter of Henry Garrett, on 15 Aug 1826 in Dungannon Church, by Rev Knox.

BLAIR: [BNL, 25 Dec 1852*, & NWH, 28 Dec 1852*] On 14th Dec, at Anketell Lodge, Stewartstown, the wife of H McCrea Blair Esq, of a son. [BNL, 18 Aug 1854*, & CCH, 19 Aug 1854*] At Anketell Lodge, Stewartstown, on 14th Aug, the wife of H McCrea Blair, of a son.

BLAKE: [SNY, 16 Feb 1811*] Miss Anne Blake was married in 1810 to Rev James Johnston at Melville. [BNL, Tue 18 Dec 1810] *Similar notice, but surname spelled “BLAIE”*. [BNL, Fri 25 Mar 1828*] On 17th March, at St John’s Church, Edinburgh, by the Rt Rev Bishop Sandford, James Murray Esq, formerly of Londonderry, to Mrs Anne Johnston, widow of Rev James Johnston.

BOND: see JOHNSTON

BOOTH: ARG, 30 Jun 1854*] Benjamin Booth, of Ballymaguin House, was married to Mary Ann, eldest daughter of Hugh White of Brookend, Stewartstown, Esq, on 5 Jun 1854 at Ardboe Church, by the Rev Mr Jones.

BOYD: [BNL, Tue 12 Sep 1827*, & BCC, 9 Sep 1827*] John Boyd of Clementstown, Co Cavan, Esq, was married to Anne, only daughter of the late James Stean of Coalisland, Esq., on 6 Sep in Killowen Church, Coleraine, by the Rev W Sillite.

BOYD: [ARG, 26 Oct 1855*, & TYC, 19 Oct 1855*] Margaret Boyd, of Ross, was married to Samuel May of Lower Back, Stewartstown on 11 Oct 1855 in the 1st Presbyterian Church, Stewartstown, by the Rev Rev I N Harkness.

BOYLE: [NWH, 19 Mar 1829*] Anne, 2nd daughter of the late Alexander Boyle Esq, of Bridge Hill, Newtownlimavady, was married to the Rev Robert Alexander Parke.

BOYLE: [BNL, Fri 25 Oct 1837] Edward Boyle Esq, of Newtownlimavady, was married to Julia, daughter of James Stirling, at Trinity Church, Belfast, by the Rev Robert Parke. [no paper quoted*] On 17 Oct 1839, the wife of Edward Boyle, at Newtownlimavady, of a daughter. [BSH, 16 Oct 1840] October 6, in the 25th year of her age, Julia, the beloved wife of Edward Boyle Esq, of Newtownlimavady. [BNL, Jun 1844*, LST, 3 Jul 1844*, & NCT, 13 Jul 1844*] On 24th June, at Trinity Church, Belfast, by the Rev Robert Parke, Edward Boyle Esq, of Newtownlimavady, was married to Marianne, youngest daughter of James Parke.

BRADBURY: see PARK

BRISCOE: see STUART

BRIDGE: see KING

BROWN: see CARUTH

BROWN: [BNL, 7 Nov 1817*] On 3rd Nov, Hugh Brown, a young man, for several years a singing clerk to the Presbyterian congregation of Stewartstown.

BROWN: [BNL, Fri 18 Apr 1823*] On 2 Apr, at Killycolpy, Co Tyrone, Dr James Brown.

BROWN: [BNL, 22 Nov 1842*, & LST, 16 Nov 1842*] On 9th Nov, at Kilcolpy, near Stewartstown, aged 92, John Brown.

BROWN: [BNL, 6 Oct 1843*, & LST, 4 Oct 1843*] Mary, youngest daughter of William Brown, Innkeeper, & Spirit & Porter Dealer, died 23 Sep at Stewartstown of consumption, “a lingering & severe illness”, aged 23.

BROWN: [LST, Fri 2 Jan 1846*] Miss Brown, of Killycolpy, near Stewartstown, on 19 Dec 1845, aged 82.

BROWN: [LST, 7 Jun 1849] On the 25th at the Presbyterian Church, Sandholes, near Cookstown, by the Rev James Geddies, Mr S Brown, Stewartstown, to Mary, only daughter of the late James Kilpatrick Esq, of Lettercleary House, near Stewartstown.

BROWN: [LST, 23 Oct 1844] At Killcolpy, Stewartstown, on the 13th ult, having given birth to a child, Mary, the beloved wife of Mr William Nelson Brown, & daughter to Mrs Thompson of Blackwatertown.

BROWN: [TYC, 2 Jul 1852, CCH, 21 Jun 1852, & BNL, 30 Jun 1852] June 21st at Stewartstown, Mr Wm Brown, proprietor of the Commercial Hotel, aged 61 years... [Short eulogy]. Died of paralysis.

BRYSON: see HOGG

BRUFF: [BNL, Tue 24 Feb & 6 Mar 1818*] Mary Anne, only daughter of the late Thomas Bruff of Coal Island, Esq, was married to Solomon Morris of Gorrin, Esq, on 13th February in New Mills Church, by the Rev Richard Murray.

BULLER: [LST, 20 Nov 1839*, & NCT, 19 Nov 1839*] Rev Arthur Buller was married to Grace Bell Ward, 2nd daughter of Charles Lynd, on 11 Nov 1839 at Old Melverton, Warwickshire. [BNL, Mon 1 May 1854*, & ARG, 5 May 1854*] On 26 Apr 1854, Mrs Buller, widow of Rev Arthur Buller.

BURKE: [BNL, Tue 28 Feb 1826*] Mrs Elizabeth Hunter, wife of Henry Hunter, & daughter of the late Major Burke, died on 19 Feb aged 57 years, at Templeragh, near Stewartstown, leaving children.

BURNS: see TIMMERALL

BURNS: [ARG, 23 Dec 1853*] Robert Burns, of Ballynakilty, Coalisland, was married to Mary, youngest daughter of Thomas Verner of Derryane, Verner's Bridge, on 18 Dec in Milltown Church, by the Rev Christopher Graham.

BURNS: [NCT, 21 Mar 1846*] Thomas Burns, of Ballymakelly, near Coalisland, was married to Jane, youngest daughter of Benjamin Kerr, of Dree, Moy, on 13 Mar at Killyman Church, by the Rev Mortimer O'Sullivan, DD.

BURNSIDE: [BNL, Tue 19 Sep 1820*] John Burnside Esq, of Millburn House, Lanarkshire, was married to Mary, youngest daughter of John Macarthur, of Glasgow, on 12 Sep in Cochran St, Glasgow, by the Rev Mr Douglas of Stewartstown.

BURRIS: [BNL, Dec 1837*] Margaret Burris, 2nd daughter of Richard Burris, of Ballintemple, King's Co, was married to Robert, son of John Park, on 2 Dec.

BURTON: [ARG, 4 May 1855*] Louisa France, 3rd daughter of Edmund Singer Burton Esq, of Churchill, Northamptonshire, was married to Robert Arthur Waller Charles, youngest son of Hon Andrew Godfrey Stuart, on 24 April.

BYERS: [BNL, Fri 10 Apr 1812*] Jackson Byers of Charlemont was married to Miss Simmonds on 7 Apr at Dungannon "on Tuesday evening last. [NCT, 20 Aug 1833*] Sarah Anne Byers, eldest daughter of the late Jackson Byers, died on 14 Aug at the residence of William Byers, her grandfather. "Kind, gentle & affectionate, scarcely emerged from an insidious consumption cut her off in the flower of life....". [BNL, 20 Aug 1833] *Similar notice, but date of death given as 11th August.*

BYERS: [LST, 29 Nov 1855*, & ARG, 30 Nov 1855*] Margaret Harmyngton Byers, daughter of John Jackson Byers, was married to Jackson McLaughlin on 22 Nov 1855 at Hilltown Church, by the bride's uncle, Rev Robert Alexander Parke.

BYERS: [BNL, Tue, 17 Oct 1815*] Mr [or Miss?] Byers, of Moy, Co Tyrone, was married to Miss [or Mr?] Cardiff on 13 Oct 1815 at Benburb Church, by the Rev D Richardson.

CAIRNES: see HOLMES

CALDWELL: [BNL, 21 & 28 Jun 1839*, & NCT, 20 Jun 1839*] Miss Caldwell of Moy was married to William Henry of Charlemont, on 16 Jun 1839 at Stewartstown Church, by the Rev William John Knox.

CAMPBELL: see ALLEN

CAMPBELL: [ARG, 3 Jul 1848*, LST, Fri 30 Jun 1848*, & BNL, 30 Jun 1848*] On 22 June, of consumption, aged 20, Andrew, 4th son of Andrew Campbell, merchant, of Stewartstown.

CAMPBELL: [BNL, Tue 29 Jun 1819*] Andrew Campbell of Ardtrea, near Stewartstown, was married to Mary Ann, daughter of the late John Campbell of Co Armagh, on 23 Jun by the Rev Samuel Eccles.

CAMPBELL: [LST, 15 Jan 1847*] Mrs Elizabeth Campbell, widow of William Campbell of Drumcairn, Stewartstown, died on 6th Jan at Milford, aged 69.

CAMPBELL: [ARG, 4 Aug 1846] On the 13th inst at the house of the bride's father, by the Rev Mr O'Tool, PP, Dungannon, Mr Francis Campbell, Coal Island, to Miss Bidilla Finn, daughter of Mr John Finn, Clanmore, Co Armagh.

CAMPBELL: [ECE, 5 Oct 1826] At Coagh, Co Tyrone, in his 58th year, George Campbell, late a Surgeon in the Royal Navy.

CAMPBELL: [BNL, Fri 12 Oct 1832*] On 28 Sep, James Campbell at Artrea, Stewartstown, aged 72.

CAMPBELL: [BNL, 6 Sep 1850*, LST, 21 Aug 1850*, & ARG, 2 Sep 1850*] On 21 Aug, aged 25, James, son of Andrew Campbell Esq, of Stewartstown.
